CIRANO's Educational App FinÉcoLab: A Fun and Effective Way to Transform Economics Education

This is the conclusion of a report presenting an evaluation of FinÉcoLab that was recently received by CIRANO. Among other things, the educational game FinÉcoLab—targeted at students in their last year of high-school and in CEGEP—allows them to learn various concepts from economics and finance while having fun as they play with different simulations and engage with interactive economic literacy learning tools. The purpose of this study was to obtain a better overview of the benefits inherent in using the educational app FinÉcoLab, which can be run on computers or tablets. The study's author, Thierry Karsenti, holds the Canada Research Chair on Information and Communication Technologies (ICTs) in education. On the basis of his work, which includes a case study conducted in a secondary school in the Montreal region, he finds that FinÉcoLab allows a variety of concepts associated with economics and finance to be learned in a fun, stimulating, meaningful, and practical setting.

entire time of the Forum, a CIRANO team staffed a booth allowing visitors to the Forum to explore CIRANO's most recent research in the use of data science for the social sciences.


Monitoring discussions about AI on Twitter #FIAresponsable: How is artificial intelligence perceived on social networks? Under the supervision of Thierry Warin, professor at HEC Montreal and CIRANO fellow, CIRANO monitored conversations about artificial intelligence on social media. The purpose of this study was to understand individuals' perceptions of artificial intelligence and the issues that arise in conversations on social networks. The most frequently recurring topics included the impact on employment and applications of IA in the healthcare system and smart cities. A summary of the research was presented in plenary session with all Forum participants.
